Proposals must address at least one of the <u>12 Grand Challenges for Social Work</u> in relation to School Social Work practice:



Individual and family well-being

- · Ensure healthy development for all youth
 - · Close the health gap
 - Stop family violence
 - Advance long and productive lives



Stronger social fabric

- Eradicate social isolation
 - End homelessness
- · Create social responses to a changing environment
 - Harness technology for social good



Just society

- Promote smart decarceration
- · Build financial capability for all
- Reduce extreme economic inequality
- Achieve equal opportunity and justice

Proposals must demonstrate intent to provide practitioners with practical applications of theory, research, evidence based practices and data driven interventions as well as innovative and/or new promising initiatives critical to current student needs.

Proposals do not need to be rigorous research projects; however, all presentations must demonstrate a clear relationship with evidence-based, data-driven, or research-based interventions and studies.

Presenters may wish engage participants in interactive activities and/or dialogue to obtain practitioner perceptions of practice tools the presenter is in the process of developing, however this must be clearly articulated within proposal workshop descriptions and limited to less than 1/4 of the workshop timed agenda.

ACSSW seeks a variety of presentations that may be considered introductory, intermediate or advanced in terms of content and application to practice:

Introductory - for audiences that lack prior knowledge and/or experience with application of presentation content.

Intermediate - presumes knowledge/experience with application of introductory concepts and focuses on intermediate content/applications.

Advanced -presumes intermediate knowledge/experience with application of intermediate concepts and focuses on advanced content/applications.

Presenter bios to are limited to 300 words, workshop titles to 10 words, and presentation descriptions to 300 words.

Proposals must also include:

3 measurable objectives: "Participants will be able to..."

Presentation Categories & Descriptions:

Intensive Workshops (3.0 hours) A session that offers hands-on interactive training or in-depth information for individuals interested in gaining advanced knowledge and/or skills related to the topic.

Workshops Sessions (1.5 hours) A session that encourages active participation and discussion and allows individuals to gain new knowledge, skills, and enhance understanding of a topic.

Presentation topics within the framework of the *Grand Challenges for Social Work* of particular interest include, but are not limited to evidence-based practices in mental health assessment & interventions, crisis response, individual and group counseling, trauma-informed care, violence reduction, suicide, eating disorders, substance abuse, self-injury, homelessness, immigrants, child abuse/neglect, poverty, pregnancy prevention/support, truancy/dropout prevention, restorative practices, PBIS/RtI, FBAs & BIPs, Adverse Childhood Experiences, neuroscience, family/parent engagement, peer leadership programs, cultural competency/diversity, collaborative partnerships with community agencies, documentation of school social work services, data-based decision making, consultation skills, leadership & advocacy roles of SSWers, social justice, boundaries & ethics, program development/evaluation, and grant writing.
